INTRODUCTION/ COURSE OVERVIEW

OBJECTIVES

This course is specifically designed for delegates who are responsible for communications, risk management, logistics, security, threat assessment, human resources or any area where having clear information is vital to performing their duties.

The course is based on the concept of Problem Based Learning (PBL). Rather than being lectured to on how to deal with a situation, delegates are provided with a problem that they have to attempt to solve practically, not in a classroom. They learn by their mistakes. This type of learning is very effective.

This course will provide delegates with the skills to be able to professionally gather information and evidence from a variety of sources in different locations and sometimes under stress.

Delegates then learn how to analyse that information so that it can be used effectively to make decisions on reducing risk, reducing threats, people and logistics management and improving security.

We are not aware of any other course delivered anywhere in the world that offers this level of practical training in communications and logistics.

SCENARIO 1

Delegates will work in teams throughout the course and will be provided with certain information which they have to analyse and act upon. In one scenario, teams will be required to work together to locate a witness/informant at a remote location. They will be provided with a budget and limited information and will then have to plan a course of action to locate the witness and then conduct an interview with this person.

As a result of the information this person provides they will travel to another location to complete other tasks.

SCENARIO 2

In an example of a second scenario, teams will conduct research on a particular geographical area where they have been directed to go to in order to gather some information (Photographs). This area will carry some risks (not physical) and therefore an assessment will need to be prepared prior to attending so that the team does not come under notice

Delegates will need to plan everything from the equipment they take, the mode of transport, the style of dress to the location they will stay overnight.

The mentioned examples are only a small part of the course but it can be seen that this course is designed to expand the delegates ability to think both strategically and tactically and increase both their powers of perception and their ability to deal with complex situations.

COURSE CONTENT

DAY1 THEORY

The day commences at the ASSI state of the art training centre where delegates will receive instruction in the following areas.

- Understanding Cultures and People
- Transport Systems
- Operating a Mobile GPS
- Investigation Techniques
- Interview and Statement Taking

DAY2 BRIEFING, PLANNING & RECONNAISSANCE

Delegates will be divided in to small manageable teams and will be provided with a briefing in regards to certain information that has been received concerning a threat.

The threat requires the teams to work both separately and together to plan a strategy by conducting inquiries through using the internet, phones and other medium to gather further information in relation to the threat which will lead them to attending various locations. At these locations they may be required to:

- Speak with Informants
- Conduct surveys
- Record and Gather Evidence
- Take Photographs
- Interview Witnesses
- Gather Intelligence by Covert Means

All the locations have different challenges which need both a tactical and strategic approach by the delegates so that the maximum amount of information can be gathered and assessed. The exercise is designed so that delegates can approach a situation with an open mind and take in all the information they have and then gather what they do not have before they act.

DAY3 ANALYSIS & INFORMATION GATHERING

As a result of the information gathered during the previous days, delegates will assess the information they have and then plan strategies for adding to that information so a full picture is obtained. Delegates will be required to travel to other locations to gather additional information. Good communications and people skills will be required to accomplish the task. Logistical skills will be needed to enable the teams to travel to the locations, some of which will be difficult to access.

Teams will work together and separately dependant on requirements and will need to transfer information to each other in order to accomplish the tasks. This segment clearly demonstrates the importance of fast but detailed communications.

Delegates will utilise state of the art technical communication equipment and learn how to use computers on wireless or hotspot networks under difficult circumstances.

WHY THIS COURSE

The International Security Intelligence Course is one of the most comprehensive intelligence gathering courses currently available and requires participants to work in many diverse and challenging environments within Australia.

This course is designed for those persons who are required as part of their employment to collect, analyse and act upon information that may effect their company or industry operations.

COURSE CONTENT

DAY 4 TEAMWORK - EMERGENCY PLANNING

Teams will continue to gather, interpret, assess and act upon information by attending various locations. These locations will be identified through the intelligence the teams have gathered during the previous days.

A planned and controlled emergency situation will arise during the day where teams need to respond to different locations but remain in contact with each other to co-ordinate a response.

This scenario will require teams to use all the skills and training they have acquired over the past 4 days.

The days training will clearly demonstrate the need for proper and professional co-ordination to occur to manage an emergency situation and teams will instinctively refer to this training in their own work environment when emergency situations occur.

DAY 5 COMPILING & PRESENTING REPORTS - DEBRIEF

Preparing and presenting briefings and de-briefings is without doubt one of the most important roles of a manager or supervisor.

Over the previous 4 days, teams will have visited a diverse range of locations and spoken to numerous persons both directly and indirectly. A great deal of information would have been gathered.

Each team is required to provide a debriefing to the course managers on their teams activities and some of the positive and negative aspects of each days activities.

This day is dedicated to having delegates provide information to others in a clear and informed manner. This is the key to ensuring that Senior Management within their own company can be briefed and de-briefed adequately on important events.

During this day teams will clearly understand how much they have learnt from the training and how they will be able to react with more professionalism and in a more responsive and effective manner when information is provided to them in their own work environment.

This could be from a security threat, emergency, terrorist attack, natural disaster or simply some information that they have heard from an employee.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

As mentioned previously, this course will be by far the most comprehensive communications and logistics courses ever offered in Australia.

Delegates on the course will not only have diverse backgrounds but travel from various overseas locations and have different cultures and different ways of dealing with situations and incidents within their workplaces.

Not only will delegates have a rare opportunity to learn about their own capabilities, strengths and weaknesses, but will learn skills from others around the world some of whom will no doubt turn out to be life long friends.

We have no doubt that this course will change the way you deal with people and handle difficult or crisis situations. Your environmental awareness will increase tenfold and you will discover attributes about yourself that until now have remained hidden.

LOCATIONS

The course requires delegates to attend various locations in an around the City where the course is being conducted. Operation will occur both during the day and the evening.

Delegates may in the morning be required to visit a small town in the Australian outback to speak with a witness and then return to the City to take a series of photographs of a vehicle that they may later have to observe to identify an informant.

IMPORTANT NOTE

This is not a classroom-based course. It is a full hands on practical based course where delegates will be first provided with basic information about a threat against a fictitious company they are working for.

The delegates will then have to work closely together as a team to develop strategies both tactical and strategic to gather further intelligence about the threat with a view to taking appropriate action to reduce or negate that threat.



OTHERS

1. Due to the unique nature of the training we would ask that each delegate be prepared to work at least 12 hours each day. Delegates will be required to stay away from the CBD on at least two nights.
